g) Ensure your model is strong, neat, and well-designed.

2. Model: Land of Incredible Taste (Food Map of India)

- Paste pictures (cut-outs)
- Make small paper flags or labels

d) Write the name of the state and its famous dish neatly.

e) Add one simple line about each food item.

f) Decorate your work neatly with colours and a proper title “Land of Incredible Taste”.
